Confirmation Service Projects — Spring 2023

This year we will have our confirmation candidates focus on (1) a Service-At-Home Challenge (2) Parish Service Project that serves the church, and (3) a Neighborhood / Community Service Project. Candidates will submit this paper for initial approval of their Service-At-Home Projects by March 6th. Final Service Projects and Reflections are due by Monday, April 24th.

Service-at-Home Challenge

The inspiration for this service at Home Project came from the book Failing Forward: Lead-

ership Lessons for Catholic Teens Today by Alan Migliorato and Darryl Dziedzic. Failing Forward hinges on the idea that facing challenges and overcoming adversity is the only way to grow strong, to learn skills, and develop character. A challenge gives a person mental, emotional, and spiritual strength. We have asked our confirmation candidates to complete a Service-at-Home Challenge, the goal of which is to help the youth to grow mentally, spiritually, and emotionally. We aim at exercising and training their muscles of virtue to help them grow in selflessness, generosity, and love of God and their neighbor.

Instructions:

1. Confirmation candidates will decide on a specific Service-at-Home Challenge after talking with their parents and will submit their challenge idea with their parent's signature on **Monday, March 6th.**

2. Candidates will turn in a written reflection of their Service-At-Home Project and all other Service Projects to either Sister Anne Elise or Miss Sullivan by **Monday, April 24th.**

How to Decide on a Service-at-Home Challenge:

Parents will decide on a challenge to give to their teen at home. This challenge must be something that will benefit/ help the rest of the family (for example, the challenge cannot be for the teen to clean their own room, paint their own room, or make their own lunch)

Recommended Challenge: Planning, Preparing, and Serving Family Dinner


